



French: Holiday Lesson 3 – Prendre congé / Taking leave. Listen to the accompanying audio.



Dire au revoir / Saying good bye:

Luc is a university student. Every time he is leaving he says goodbye.

N.B: The accompanying audio will help you to pronounce correctly. Practise pronunciation.

Luc is leaving class (after a lesson)	Luc is leaving school (after classes)
 <p>A</p> <p>Au revoir Luc</p> <p>Au revoir Madame</p>	 <p>B</p> <p>Au revoir !</p> <p>AU REVOOOIR !</p>

In French, another form of 'Good Bye' is 'Salut'. Note that 'Salut' is also used in French as an informal greeting as well. Salut! to mean ' Hello!/Hi! '

Luc is leaving the lunch room (after lunch)	Luc is leaving his friend (for break time)
 <p>C</p> <p>Salut Veronique !</p> <p>Salut Luc !</p>	 <p>D</p> <p>Salut Zoé</p> <p>Salut Luc</p>

N.B: As earlier said, the conversations in Pictures C & D can also mean an informal way of greeting with a ' hello ! '
